Background

Majlis Belia Brunei (MBB) or Brunei Youth Council in English (BYC) is an organisation consisting of a **combination of associations, youth movements and youth companies registered with any government agency in Brunei Darussalam**. It is located in Bandar Seri Begawan and has branches in the four Districts in Brunei Darussalam which are named the District Youth Council except for Brunei and Muara Districts. As such, the administration of the Brunei Youth Council is all based in the city. Like other existing youth councils, MBB acts as a main body to support youth communities and organisations in Brunei. It is considered a centre for networking for youth individuals and groups to gather and build ideas collectively.

Since its establishment in 1959, it has continued to engage and partner up with youth organisations in Brunei, as well as other countries like Malaysia, Indonesia, South Korea, China. One of MBB's proud accomplishments is that it **expanded its connection on a regional level and became more active in participating in dialogues and conferences in the ASEAN forum with ASEAN youth organisations**.

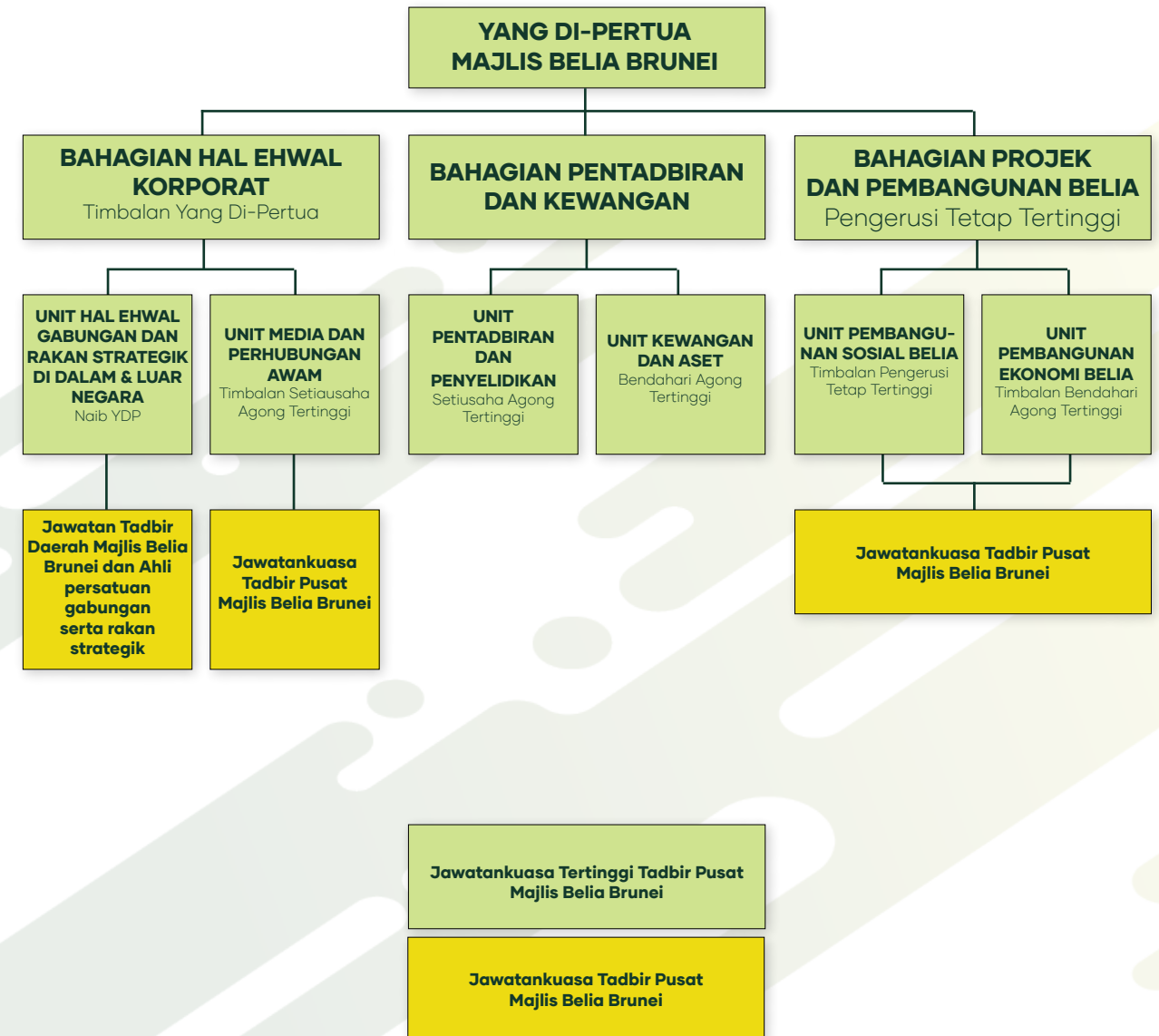

MAKING DIRECTIONS FOR THE YOUTH

Majlis Belia Brunei's original aim has not changed since it first established, it hopes to unite all youth and welfare bodies in Brunei into one huge and solid council in order to promote the economic, social, cultural, physical, mental and spiritual development of youth. MBB desires to instill in them a sense of national identity (MIB) and a spirit of dedicated, responsible and useful youths. It was the late Pengiran Yusof bin Pg. Haji Abdul Rahim or also known as Yura Halim who founded the Council in 1959, back when Brunei was still on the road to independence. From thereon, the Council has been officiated by different leaders, including some well-known names in Brunei and like other organisations, also has its ups and downs.

The early years, especially in the late 60s and early 70s, saw an enthusiastic start with MBB members actively joining voluntary programmes and holding events such as the renowned *Majlis Kongres Agung Perwakilan Majlis Belia Brunei*. MBB then met some difficulties between 1988 to 2000. On the 26th February 2000, MBB was unfortunately annulled due to the failure of handing yearly and financial reports from 1988 to 1993. However, afterwards many parties wished to bring back MBB and among them were the *Penaja Majlis Belia Kebangsaan* or Sponsor of the National Youth Council, MBB Protem Committee and Majlis Belia in Tutong. Eventually, their appeal was accepted and it was once again re-established on the 28th September 2000. This would be the transformation era where former MBB members such as Dr Haji Hashim bin Haji Abdul Hamid, Pengiran Haji Suhaimi bin Pengiran Wahid and Haji Mohd Firdaus bin Orang Kaya Haji Noordin led the Council to more activities and involvement in youth-related events.

After 2002, MBB's net-working progressed to the regional and international levels. Some notable mentions of affiliated associations included WAY (World Assembly of Youth), CAYC (Council for ASEAN Youth Cooperation), WAMY (World Association of Muslim Youth), MBM (*Majlis Belia Malaysia*), ASEM Youth Dialogue, The National Council of Youth Organization in Korea, Muda Banteng Indonesia (MBI) and so on.

By 2007, MBB managed to connect and collaborate with about 50 youth and welfare associations along with more than 20,000 youths in all over 4 districts. The Council has participated in almost every main event in Brunei such as National Day, *Maulidur Rasul*, His Majesty's anniversary, *Hari Belia Kebangsaan* (International Youth Day) etc. MBB did not miss out the dialogues and discussions on global issues such as climate change, particularly during

the year 2010 and onwards. Leadership and empowerment programmes increased as well along with youth exchanges programmes (for the sake of self-development and nation-building.)

MBB's struggles and challenges deal with consistency in reaching their goals, coordinating other organisations in a systematic way and lacking the media exposure in promoting MBB as the national council. Despite being constantly active, continuing the predecessors' success and maintaining the links between organisations had been difficult throughout the years. After 2017, MBB was becoming less active because of those challenges and entering the digital era, MBB had to complement the new ways of promoting the Council in order to appeal to the new generation.

The new reform era in 2019 became a year of hope for MBB once again as the new committee members took the chance of reviving MBB's spirit. Youth exchanges and conferences resumed and despite COVID-19, MBB members still participated in the ASEAN youth meeting, which took place in 2020. As more active organisations and NGOs are developing in Brunei, MBB aspires to continue the legacy of former MBB leaders and ensure that the role of youth is always relevant in Brunei's progress and development.

Founder's Story

Background

Yang Amat Mulia Pengiran Setia Negara Pengiran Dr. Haji Mohd Yusuf bin Pengiran Haji Abdul Rahim was notable for many things, especially his service and hard work to the government of Brunei. He was one of the major contributors in Brunei's national development, constantly giving hope and igniting national spirit to the youth since the 1950s. He was the founder of *Majlis Belia Brunei* back when the Council was known as *Majlis Pemuda Pemudi* in 1959.

In the literary world, YAM was known as Yura Halim, a pen name he used as a writer. He held various government posts during his working days. On top of that, he was a national hero and a fighter for the Bruneian people when Brunei was still under the British control. YAM had experienced the war years in the 1940s and faced the difficulties during the pre-independence era of Brunei.

The late YAM was born on May 2, 1923, at Kampong Kandang, Tutong. In the 1930s, he trained as a teacher at the *Sultan Idris Teachers (SIT) College* in Tanjong Malim, Perak. Inspired by the nationalist movement there, he helped to form the Brunei Youth Movement with HM Salleh in 1946 and eventually founded the Brunei Youth Council in 1959. He was a close associate of Al-Marhum Sultan Haji Omar 'Ali Saifuddin Sa'adui Khairi Waddien ibni Al-Marhum Sultan Muhammad Jamalul Alam and assisted him in making Brunei advance further as a nation.

YAM's Journey

During the Japanese Occupation in the 1940s, the Japanese officials saw how capable and intelligent YAM was and sent him to Hiroshima University, Japan in 1944. Although this was halted due to the atomic bombings in Hiroshima by the United States in 1945 and he was one of the few Southeast Asian survivors.

YAM made his mark outside Brunei as well. He received an Honorary Doctorate in Law by the International Academy of Vancouver, in 1961 for his contributions and active involvement in public administration. In 2013, he was conferred with an honorary doctorate from Hiroshima University for his role in promoting peace and goodwill between Japan and Brunei Darussalam. He was also acknowledged in the literary world and was the 8th Bruneian to receive the Southeast Asian Writer's Award or S.E.A. Write Award in 1993.

In the government field, YAM became the Deputy State Secretary and was the first Bruneian Director of Information in 1962. He later became the State Secretary in 1967. He remarkably rose to become a Menteri Besar or Chief Minister from 1967 until 1972 when he officially retired from public service.

Impact on Society

YAM had been a teacher, state secretary, chief minister, High Commissioner of Brunei to Malaysia, and the Brunei Ambassador to Japan and many other things. Most importantly, he wanted Brunei to have a voice. *Majlis Pemuda Pemudi* was one of his early initiatives to encourage people to express their views on the society's issues openly in the public. He even played a leading role towards the establishment of *Media Permata*.

In his personal life, he was quite close to his grandchildren whom he often shared his wartime experiences with. For his grandchildren, it was evident to YAM that peace and freedom were extremely important for a nation and he had been a part of the struggle that helped build Brunei to be peaceful as it is now. They also recalled how their grandfather valued discipline and that he liked doing things on his own, without asking help from others.

In 2016, he was laid to rest at the *Sengkarai Muslim Cemetery, Tutong*. Even though he officially retired in the 1970s, he was still holding an appointed membership in Brunei's Legislative Council during that year. YAM had led an incredible career not just in the number of the posts he held, but in how he persevered and never gave up in his ideas of spreading awareness on the importance of culture, literature, history and progress in general.

- *'Barat-Timur dan Bom Atom'* (2002)

Who is Belia / Youth?

According to Dasar Belia, Belia or Youth is anyone who is in the ages between 15 to 35 years. Its age range is different from the United Nations' definition of Youth, which only include who are within the ages of 15 and 24 years. In 2013, this group of Belia or Youth makes over 50% of the total population in Brunei and in 2019, it is estimated to be over 45% of the population and remains to be the majority group out of 459,500 people. This indicates how important it is to rely on the Belia or Youth since they will be leading the country in the future.

Wawasan 2035

The word 'wawasan' or vision in English, originally comes from a Javanese word that carries the meaning of being understanding or being perceptive on something such as a concept. It is having the ability to imagine and envision things. In general, 'wawasan' holds the meaning of ideas, inspirations or goals in achieving success in the future. 'Berwawasan' or having a vision is associated with the progress or future development of, for instance, a society, in order to achieve goals that are considered important.

In Wawasan 2035, the vision refers to His Majesty's desire towards forming **these three things!**

'Negara zikir' (nation of remembrance)

Developing human resources in the field of entrepreneurship

Valuing the concept of MIB

Generasi Berwawasan

A popular and recurring term that often appears nowadays and is related to Wawasan 2035 and MIB. It simply refers to the Belia or Youth group, more specifically, the young generation who is perceptive and motivated towards achieving success and the Vision 2035 goals. They are not only trusted to be the future leaders, but are also encouraged to be proactive and courageous in pursuing their goals as shown from His Majesty's titahs on youth.

THE MEDLEY HOUSE PRODUCTIONS

the home for local storytellers



In reaching the goals of Wawasan Brunei 2035, Medley House Productions believes that their platform would be able to enrich the youths and harness their skills in creativity. By learning how to showcase and voice out, they can be advocates of meaningful messages and help the society in Brunei. This friendship-built has brought Medley House Productions to come alive and strive to be better as they provide a 'home' for all the creatives in Brunei.

Medley House Productions is Brunei's local storytelling company. It began with five strangers who then became friends because of their shared passion in the art of theatre. During this time, this circle of creatives started brainstorming ideas to continue their passion in the creative industry, leading to the start-up of Medley House Productions.

The word 'Medley' means variety. As each of the Medley members possesses a diverse set of skills in terms of directing, visualizing, choreographing, and music production, they thought of associating their variety of talents into a word to brand themselves, and they found 'Medley'!

Their journey began in 2019 where they started showcasing their plays. Most of the plays by Medley House Productions are community-based, addressing important societal issues. Their first project together back when they were in the Performing Arts Club (PAC) in UBD was called Aftermath which focused on topics of depression and anxiety. They made their debut, *Where Does Love End* with the purpose of raising awareness towards suicide. Officially, this was Medley's first play.

Medley collaborated with the Community Development Department under the Ministry of Culture, Youth and Sports, to organise a play called Peer Empathize

and Embracing Resilience (PEER) Programme. It aimed to create a support system for peers who are experiencing mental health issues. Director's Cut: Take One, consisted of three original short theatre plays; *What The Hell Bill*, *Trouble* and *The Origins of the Solar System*.

Proper documentation and paperwork was the first challenge as well as lack of manpower when they started building the company from the ground up. However, the team managed to push through and learn along the journey. Medley House Productions is always open for collaborations and all it takes for the youth to join them is just that little bit of courage to take the first step forward and to put yourself out there because you won't know what's to come unless you try. One of the Medley's team, Rudy, tweak-quoted **"practice makes easier" holds close to his heart instead of "practice makes perfect."** The Medley members even shared some tips and encouraging words for the interested youth to be part of Medley.

Take the first step. That's always the scariest part but after that, it's a journey. It's a great journey. - Amirah

I think they just need to take the initiative for themselves, and the rest, we can work from there. If you take that first step, it means you're willing to change, you're willing to grow because we can't do that for you. We can only help you to improve your skills. - Van

Medley is working on their next biggest production yet! Something different from the other productions that they have had.

HINT: Environment. It's going to have an interesting twist—"post-apocalyptic" Brunei kinda show.



THE CREATIVE CORE

creating conversation around art

The Creative Core BN creates online and offline platforms for creatives from various sectors to **create opportunities for collaboration to create new works and projects within the creative industry.** Essentially, the main aim of The Creative Core BN is to **educate the general public about the value of art in the society through highlighting the creative process that goes into a piece of artwork.** An additional objective would be to upskill creatives and assist them in building a sustainable career pathway by utilizing this space where they can come together.

It was established unofficially in 2015 which started with their first event called DancersMeet and that eventually led to a registered organisation. It is co-founded by Charlotte Lim, an art enthusiast who desired to do something within the creative industry. She sought a way to expand networking by creating an event. The first event has since become their flagship event. It brought together dancers from various genres and backgrounds to meet and create a new piece together. The process was filmed and the actual event was the showcase portion of it.

Behind the name 'The Creative Core' conveys two interconnected meanings. Firstly, the state of human beings, their experiences and backgrounds directly correlate with the art they produce which makes art so unique and hence, they are known as the creatives. On the second part, the core of creativity is basically the human being and their own creativity.

Impart, impact and inspire are the three words of principle The Creative Core live by. By creating an event is by imparting knowledge to the creatives, or the creatives impart knowledge to us. Moreover, it's also impacting the community and inspiring others.

A memorable moment for the team was being part of National Youth Day in 2019. Seeing youths

from different communities gather to celebrate meaningful purpose was a heartfelt experience.

Team management is one of the essential internal factors to own for The Creative Core which makes it a challenge. One other challenge being in The Creative Core, externally, was the blackout period that cut off basically six months from the year to do any public entertainment events. This hinders the economic growth and development of the creative organisation and industry as a whole

The Creative Core is always collaborating with others to hold an event. Therefore, the team wishes to set up partnerships with the public and private organisations to help build the industry and create more meaningful projects. Even better, gaining the connectivity with the ASEAN members. From this movement, The Creative Core hopes to create more platforms for artists to grow the art culture in Brunei.

The next big offline event that they are having is called **'Creative Economy Week'** which will be held in December 2020. It is a week-long creative work festival highlighting the creative economy, which started last year in August. The idea is to **showcase the array of creatives independently as well as those who are planted in corporate and government organisations.**



saving through recycling

GREEN DEPOT

Green Depot is a recycling centre located in Kuala Belait, which started as a project initiative by Green Brunei. It was founded in December 2018 by Yang Berhormat Khairunnisa Ash'ari. Initially, it was set up **to promote better waste management practices in the country. Due to the lack of awareness on how and where to recycle, this facility was then installed to provide access for people to recycle.**

The centre now operates as a social enterprise that encourages residents in Brunei Darussalam to recycle. By educating them about the importance of recycling, it also introduces the concept of saving, where people can earn and save money by simply recycling.

According to the current project officer of Green Depot, Fathin AMJ, while people generally know about the 3Rs, which refer to Reduce, Reuse and Recycle, the specificities of recycling are still unclear for many people. Thus, Green Depot aims to inform the public that they go as far as recovering natural resources by reducing pollution and solid waste production.

Green Depot has conducted numerous events and projects such as delivering educational school talks in Belait District initiated with Jabatan Daerah Belait. The talks emphasized on raising awareness to the young people about recycling and maintaining cleanliness of the environment. Other projects such as donation drives and weekend thrift markets are also thriving. Apart from Kuala Belait, Green Depot's second branch is located in Kampung Bolkuah 'A' in Kampong Ayer, acting as a local community for distributing thrift items.

Some challenges faced by Green Depot KB include the lack of exposure of the facility to the public, and lack of manpower and volunteers. In the past, the majority of volunteers were from Brunei-Muara District. However, recently the number of volunteers from Belait has risen up steadily.

To appeal to the public more, Green Depot has a website (recover.green-depot.com) where people can sign up and register an account to keep track of their recyclables in kilograms after being weighted by the organisation team members.

Green Depot hopes the concept of 3Rs will become a norm to the society in order to create a better environment. The meaning of this can be reflected from a Cree Indian Proverb that YB Khairunnisa holds on to:

**Only after the last tree has been cut down,
only after the last river has been poisoned,
only after the last fish has been caught,
only then will you find that money cannot be eaten.**



BruWILD

BIODIVERSITY & NATURAL HISTORY SOCIETY

biodiversity conservation through education and action

BruWILD is a local NGO that works towards protection and conservation of biodiversity and natural heritage. Lin Ji Liaw, the president of BruWILD, started this initiative in 2013 from what started as a Facebook group. The impetus to **drive positive change for biodiversity and to create youth-led platforms for biodiversity conservation were the two main driving factors in creating BruWILD.**



BruWILD was officially established in April 2014 aiming to protect biodiversity through education and action. BruWILD consists of members graduated from different fields of expertise, including botanist, mammal specialist, ornithologist (bird experts) and plant phytochemist.

With these knowledge, BruWILD aims to engage the Brunei community to share the passion as well as to increase the awareness of biodiversity protection.

There are currently four projects conducted by BruWILD Eco-Edu Program, Report and Rescue, Saving Our Ocean, and lastly a new addition, Combating Climate Change. More details of these projects can be referred at www.bruwild.org.

Through the four projects outlined above, BruWILD has collaborated with a number of agencies, consisting of NGOs, social enterprises and business operators. These collaborations allow the team to reach out to wider audiences through creative and educational means.

BruWILD targets to launch a micro-documentary on Brunei's beautiful mangroves end of this year as a follow-up to their 'Tiny Heroes of Our Sea' micro-documentary that was launched in conjunction with World Ocean Day last year.

BruWILD hopes for Brunei to be able to achieve a balance between urban development and biodiversity conservation in pursuit of the Wawasan 2035.

Where your content #MATTERS



Matters of Choice (MoC) is an innovative platform for content creators, **born from the desire to create content that matters**. MoC started from participating in small competitions and producing videos that were solely for entertainment purposes. In due course, MoC was able to reach out to more people and they decided to add more messages and meanings in their videos.

MoC visualises themselves as the leading platform by bringing different types of content creators to share their opinions and thoughts in creating content that actually matters to people. From these contents, **its mission is to continually make it as a source of amal jariah, a charity for everyone who is involved in the projects and to contemplate creativity amongst each other.**

One of the core members of MoC, Mateen, explained that the reason he joined MoC was because of his admiration for the late actor, Tan Sri. P. Ramlee. Although he is no longer here, the positive messages in his movies are still impactful to this day. This reminded him of one Prophetic Hadith, that says that if the son of Adam has passed away, his 'amal jariah' can still be relayed through knowledge that is beneficial to us. So for Mateen, **being in MoC enables him to continue the 'amal jariah' or the good deeds to the future generation.**

The way MoC works is by conducting a weekly session with the MoC team to brainstorm ideas for their new contents. It is usually based on recent and trending topics such as the importance of suicide prevention awareness. Adam Abdullah, one of MoC members, has shared a few ways to make content. One is considering what type of messages to be relayed, and then being aware of the current issues such as COVID-19. Finally, re-enacting, which is recreating acts that people can relate to, but in MoC's style.

In the long run, MoC discovered that they could get a source of funding by reaching out to other businesses and in return, MoC would incorporate them into their content. As for their future plans, **MoC intends to conduct workshops that offer to help creating video contents and also to educate and enrich people's creativity, especially the youths.** For MoC, their best slogan would be 'where your content matters.'

we make Bruneian-related podcast

Suara Kitani is a self-funded video and audio podcasting platform, and a registered society under *Majlis Belia Brunei (MBB)*. The name 'Suara Kitani' is simply from Bruneians voicing out about Bruneian issues. **It aims to spread knowledge and awareness on trending and important topics in Brunei Darussalam. Its core objective is to provide Bruneians an online platform, a safe space so they can express their ideas, opinions and experiences on various topics through podcasting.**

Suara Kitani was established in February 2020 and began their first content showcasing Brunei's National Day. They work on creating new content every week as a motivation to drive their passion as content creators. Suara Kitani originated as a passion project with online interviews and podcasts with friends. As a newly established platform in early 2020, they managed to grow their team and production crew to explore various interesting video contents as well as podcast streams.

With the small number of local podcasters in Brunei, Suara Kitani hopes to provide fellow Bruneians a safe online platform to share stories to a large audience, in which they also aim to reach international audiences one day. Furthermore, members of Suara Kitani **aspire to improve the content creation industry in Brunei, especially for the youth as it can create great opportunities for the future.**

Persatuan Kemajuan Insan, known as Persatuan KESAN, is a combination of two words; **KE**majuan **in**SAN. It is an NGO where **it empathizes with youth syakhsiyah, which in an arabic term means personality, and leadership skills.** They were established in 2006 and they originally focused on four aspects: **leadership, motivation, volunteerism and research.** These were what was identified as the gaps in society where KESAN hoped to fit into.

Its vision is **Menjana Insan Mulia** which means to generate noble human beings and with that KESAN wants its youth to build respected moral character based on Islam. Their mission is **Melahirkan Pemimpin Belia** which means to bring forth an individual to become a role model yang bersyukur by respecting and following Melayu Islam Beraja concept in Brunei Darussalam.

They aim to **provide a platform for the youths to learn new skills, make use of tools and techniques to be an effective leader in an Islamic way.** With this in mind, they provide mentoring and instill Islamic leadership values in youths aged 16 to 27 years old under a programme called 'Catalyst System'. They also offer programmes that cater to youth development such as RE: Mindset and Leaders Ignition Training (LIT) and MANDIRI which are tailored for college students and undergraduates.

Under the Catalyst System programme, participants will enjoy the full opportunity of experiencing workshop training, ranging from personal development to leadership and management skills. **In addition, they are offered volunteering opportunities to gain experience and networking with other NGOs or platforms.** With this, KESAN is wholly devoted to improving and developing the youth in the nation through this platform.

For KESAN, locals among the youths need to sustain ethics and develop their moral character. The members perceived that they carry a huge responsibility because it is their initiative for improving youth development and bettering changes to each individual's character. As youths enter secondary schools after finishing religious schools, KESAN starts seeing the lack of morals, ethics and understanding of the fundamentals of Islam. **Hence, KESAN is available as a support system in Brunei by being a 'tree' wanting to shelter and support the youth.**

KESAN has recently conducted two main events; brewing mindset and focusing on growth mindset for high school students. With the LIT 'Leaders Ignition Training' programme which is for 15 to 20 years old, it concentrates on time management and project management. For future ones, they are in progress of developing a series called 'A Graduate Employability' series to address the issue of unemployability amongst the youths in Brunei.



A network to nurture young professionals development in Brunei Darussalam

Young Professionals Network Brunei (YPN BN) is a **platform to advocate professional capacity building for young people who aspire to be leaders at various levels. It inspires to promote networking dialogues, mentorships and workshops.**

YPN was established in 2018 where three youth advocates came together with ideas in helping the government to eradicate unemployment. In February 2019, YPN started with a logo. The members then sought input by engaging with mentors, thought processors and their opinions on how to run the organisation.

Eventually YPN set their three main goals. The first one is **to promote networking, dialogue and mentorship amongst young professionals, graduates and industry.** Secondly is **to support young people to develop the best version of themselves.** The third goal is **to advocate for young people's participation, development and leadership at various levels, sectors and industries.**

Four initiatives are regulated in YPN. There are Mentorship WeCan; connecting mentees to mentors for personal and professional development, Impact Dialogue Series; open dialogue sessions **aimed at providing opportunities for exchange of insights and more,** Leadership Circle; a community platform to gather leaders and managers to collectively discuss insights, frustrations and best practices in leadership, and EmployAbility; a response to the growing demand to prepare youth to be employable by providing various exposures to soft skills and leadership development. YPN highlights their mentorship programme where they have close conversations with mentees to mentors with different ages and backgrounds to share their insights from personal to professional experiences. The importance of mentoring is to provide guidance for people to learn, and that taking on mentorship would be the best first step to being successful.

One of YPN core members, Fadli Zaini, stated that although their interest group is the youths, it is also a network for all and YPN welcomes everyone as a source of knowledge as it is a respectful industry and not a club.



Youth Against Slavery Brunei, or known as YAS Brunei, is a YSEALI youth-lead initiative locally and regionally. They are working on raising the awareness of human trafficking and labour rights issues. YAS Brunei's objectives include conducting outreach programmes as well as spreading information about these issues in Brunei or regionally in Asia.

YAS Brunei was established in late 2014 but it was officially launched in 2015. Amal, a co-founder of YAS Brunei, explained that this initiative started when both co-founders joined an exchange programme called YSEALI. That was when they proposed to do a project focusing on human trafficking all around ASEAN which has led to this day.

In working on their initiative, YAS Brunei members received training from International Organisation for Migration (IOM) to learn about topics of migration and human trafficking. They were taught how to engage people in terms of raising awareness and how to engage with related stakeholders.

Throughout YAS Brunei's journey, they learned about human trafficking in the Bruneian context and how some things are normalised in our culture. For example, forced labour and discrimination against domestic workers. Challenges like this and the lack of information on migration and human trafficking in Brunei motivated YAS Brunei to work harder. YAS Brunei managed to reach out to police stations, labour and immigration departments and work together with them.

Throughout YAS Brunei's journey, they learned about human trafficking in the Bruneian context and how some things are normalised in our culture. For example, forced labour and discrimination against domestic workers. Challenges like this and the lack of information on migration and human trafficking in Brunei motivated YAS Brunei to work harder. YAS Brunei managed to reach out to police stations, labour and immigration departments and work together with them.

In the future, YAS Brunei will be running a project called **Insan Ramadhan** where they will distribute food packs to migrant workers in Brunei as well as COVID-19 info packages. They are also collaborating with ASEAN-Australia Strategic Youth Partnership for the "Break the Chain" project, focusing on human trafficking and vulnerability post COVID-19 pandemic.

Projek Bina Ukhwah or as short, PBU, is a platform to help sustain underprivileged families in Brunei Darussalam. The mission and vision is to lend a hand to the families by ensuring a safe living environment, either via renovation or building a new house for them, in addition to empowering them through education and training.

PBU was established in 2017 by Pg Haji Ahmad Fadillah Akbar Pg Haji Sellahuddin and Dk Nur Duratul Ain bt. Pg Sarjuddin. The name itself came up from 'membina ukhwah' which originates from the intention of PBU not solely just building a house but also building bonds between the community, the economically challenged families as well as volunteers within the organisation.

A few challenges faced by PBU are finding people who are willing to commit in trying to stabilize the organisation and also in terms of generating fundings for projects. Lacking of manpower is also another part of the challenge where most of the projects conducted require volunteers to help out. However, it always starts with one's intention to help volunteer as well. As PBU believes that by helping others, they are actually also helping themselves.



PBU representatives from this interview shared insightful advice to always refresh niat, in other words, be intentional before starting a project or even start doing anything for the sake of Allah. At the end of the day, any efforts being put into, time and energy for solving and finding solutions to problems, are for the sake of finding redha Allah. Additionally, PBU also believes impact does not need to be perfect however it demands to be heard. Thus, any impact whether small or big, will lead to a ripple effect encouraging others to follow along in making positive changes in the community.

This organisation needs to continue operating in Brunei as there are still families out there who live with no basic supplies such as water and electricity, and so PBU functions as a support system to these underprivileged families. So far, PBU has received generous donations from the public and that Bruneian people are very charitable.

PBU team hopes for youths to participate themselves into this organisation and to open up their minds and be aware to see into the real world that there are underprivileged families in need of help and support.

a platform to create sexual violence awareness in Brunei

RespectME is a youth-led community, established in October 2019, which **concerns raising awareness on sexual violence in Brunei**. This could be in the form of harassment, assault, abuse, domestic violence and others committed against both male and female victims. **RespectME stands by the quote, "Voice of sexual violence matters."**

Its vision is to reduce sexual violence occurring in Brunei whereas its mission comes in three parts. The community strives to share stories anonymously of such occurrences that are happening in Brunei. Then they will carry out educational projects with the purpose of improving the society's response in relations to sexual assault and other forms of sexual violence. By educating students about it, they hope to create an understanding society. Ultimately, **the community wishes to provide a safe haven for victims of sexual violence.**

The desire to help and resolve the mistreatment against the victims is the driving force of RespectME. They learned that things like victim-blaming and how sexual violence became a taboo subject in both Brunei and worldwide, needed to improve. It was challenging for the team sometimes due to the lack of support and awareness given to these matters.

Yet the team persevered and held on to this one Hadith by Sahih Muslim: **"Whoever among you sees an evil action, then let him change it with his hand (by taking action); if he cannot, then with his tongue (by speaking out); and if he cannot, then with his heart - and that is the weakest of faith."** This further bolstered RespectME's resolve in carrying out their initiative.

Currently, RespectME is organising 'RespectME Support Group' this August until October, an 8-week session for females. They are planning to distribute purple coloured ribbons and posters to respective gyms and cafes in all four districts during the Domestic Violence Month, in October. There will also be a support group made for male survivors and victims next year.

Fauziyyah Anani Hj Abdul Manap is a 28-year-old mother of two sons and she is working as a psychologist. She is passionate about youth development and keeps this quote close to her heart: "If you want to destroy a nation, you destroy the youth but if you want to build a nation, you build the youth." For her, **the role of youth in the society is so important that when they feel lost, it will indirectly influence the nation's economy, development and potential to grow.**

Miss Fauziyyah envisions a community that thrives and is not afraid to fulfill their passion and creativity in contributing to society. In addition, a community that is supportive, whichever age group they are in. Miss Fauziyyah's mission is **to contribute by influencing a good mindset, like the idea of "Inspire to be inspired."** Accordingly, she has been working on her book containing a variety of aspiring topics, with her spouse's support. Miss Fauziyyah **wants to encourage the readers to focus on solving the problems instead of the failures or mistakes. She believes that going from a fixed mindset to a growth mindset allows us to improve ourselves.**

Her source of inspiration is particularly by Nouman Ali Khan and Aida Azlin's podcasts and YouTube videos regarding self-developments as well as stories from the Qur'an. For instance, she was moved by the story of Maryam in Surah Maryam, who gave birth alone under a palm tree, showing a woman's incredible strength. Understanding the Qur'an helps her to understand more about human and living things in this world.

In the future, Miss Fauziyyah wishes to collaborate with local publishing companies as she aims to reach out to the young people. She wants to build resilience in young people so that they are able to back from any problems and challenges that they encounter.

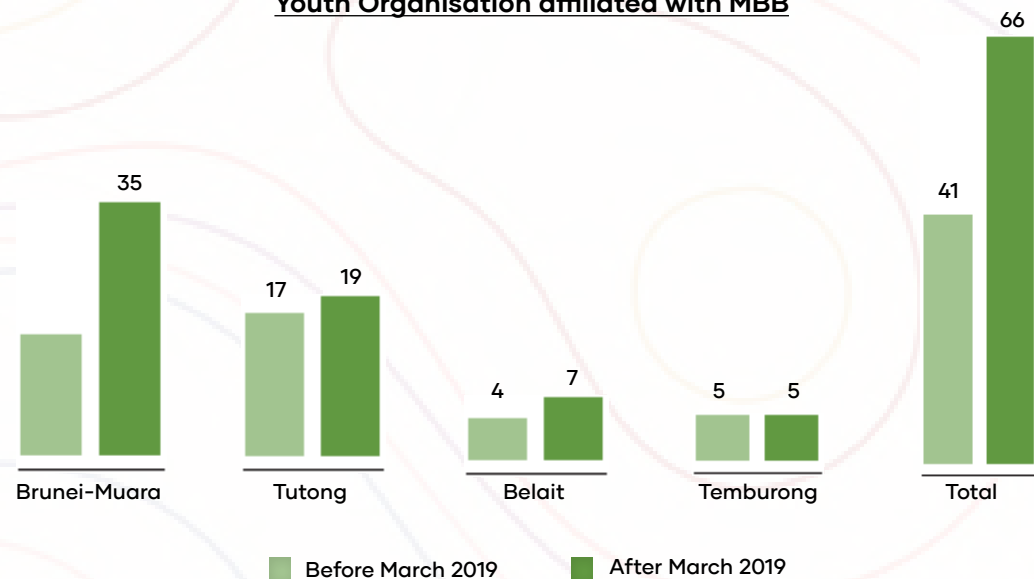

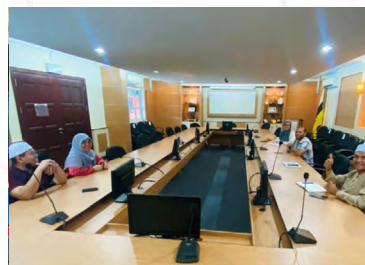

4. They can be revoked, changed and replaced through the collective decisions of AJKTTP
